

NEW CARD VS. OLD CARD

NEW DL/ID CARD IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Nevada has updated the design of its Driver's Licenses and Identification Cards. All DMV offices will be issuing the new design by the end of August, 2021. Online services will be converted in late July.

The new design will be issued the next time you renew, replace, or make any major change to your license information whether you complete the transaction online or in person at a DMV office.


The design of the new card is different than that of the existing card with the "Battle Born" insignia being most prominent on the DL/ID. Other features include images of the Sierra Nevada Mountains and the Las Vegas skyline.

OLD DL/ID CARD IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Your existing credential will remain valid and accepted at all locations until it expires.

Please do not visit a DMV office only to get a new card.


There is no need to replace your existing license until it is due for renewal or you have another change such as an address change, name change or Real ID upgrade..

MAJOR DIFFERENCES

- The Nevada titling will now be at the top left of the card.
- Card type will be displayed at the top of the card.
- The validity marker of the card (Real ID star or Not for Real ID purposes) will be displayed at the top right of the card. Driver Authorization Cards are marked Not Valid for ID.
- The New DL/ID background color will fade from Blue to Green and back to Blue across the face of the card.
- Various card design elements have changed.
- Order of card data has changed. In order from top to bottom, left to right, DL# is not at the top, whether the card is limited term, followed by Date of Birth (DOB), Name, Address, DL class, DL Endorsements, DL Restrictions, Issue Date, Expiration Date, personal biometric data of the owner, lastly any indicators of organ donor, veteran status or other specific DL/ID markers.
- Perforation data now matches the owner's initial of the first name, the owners height in inches, and the initial of their last name (e.g. John Sample 5'-10" will be J70S).
- DOB will be restated on the card, next to the weight of the owner, with a raised feel for security purposes.
- There will be an indentation of the owner's initial of the first name, initial of their last name, and the last two digits of their birth year. (e.g. John Sample 1969 will be JS69) at the bottom of the portrait.
